I absolutely loved completing the <u>Adobe and Microsoft accreditations</u> and this led me to achieving my <u>digital bronze badge</u> with Rise. I'd never set up a LinkedIn profile before, but these badges and awards made me feel I actually had something to put on there, even if I hadn't finished my course yet. My personal tutor encouraged me to step out of my comfort zone further though and try to develop more interpersonal skills by trying some in-person experiences or events. I have to say this did make me very nervous but I started small, attending one-hour sessions with Rise and <u>Careers</u>, until I felt confident enough to do something longer. I then went along to the <u>Comic and Zine taster</u> session and everyone was so relaxed and friendly, it made it easier to go back and get involved.

Although I'm ambitious, I've struggled to know how to get there. I'm not sure what the journey looks like or the kind of experiences and skills I need to have by the time I finish university. Future me plan helped structure that and now I'm pleased to report that not only have I finished my Foundation year, but I have been accepted onto a Degree Apprenticeship! I still feel out of place at times, but already I'm feeling more confident and can see how getting involved in different experiences outside my course will help me improve my professional skills in particular. I have also realised that getting a balance is important, I think at times I put too much pressure on myself. Luckily it worked out ok this year, but I have realised going at that intense pace any longer would have just led to burn out. This reflection process has been helpful, and I can see how I want to take things forward next year.
